Provisional Professional Teaching License

This fact sheet is intended to provide information pertaining to The Provisional Professional Teaching route to Licensure.

What is the Provisional Professional Teaching License, PPTL?

A three year provisional educator license issued to an experienced professional for the purpose of teaching Secondary content areas in an Arkansas public or charter school.

What must I submit to qualify for the PPTL?

- *Contact ADE for an Application Packet
- *First step
 - Completed application
 - Official Bachelor's degree transcript with a minimum 2.7 overall grade point
 - 3 years of verified employment experience in the specific content area of licensure
 - Justification statement by the applicant, relating employment experience to the content area
 - 2 professional recommendation letters
- *ADE will approve or deny and respond to the applicant
- *Second step
 - Passing scores on Praxis C.O.R.E or approved equivalent exam
 - Passing score(s) on Praxis Content area exam(s)
 - Cleared Background Checks and Child Maltreatment Central Registry Check

What happens next?

• If approved, the Office of Educator Licensure will send a letter of eligibility for the 3 year PPTL

When will the provisional license be issued?

- Upon receipt of the signed letter of eligibility and offer of employment to teach classes for credit, part or full-time, in an Arkansas Public or Charter School
- Upon receipt of the pre-service professional development

How do I convert to a 5 year standard license?

- Passing score on the Praxis pedagogy exam
- 24 hours of pedagogy training
- Mentored for 3 years
- Rating of proficient or above on the summative evaluation at end of 3 years
- Recommendation from employing superintendent for the standard license
- Pay fee \$75
