The Arkansas Department of Education, Division of Elementary and Secondary Education, has reviewed the documentation submitted by the Lakeside School District in support of the District's claim that provisions of an enforceable desegregation court order or a courtapproved desegregation plan bars the District from participating in school choice under the Public School Choice Act of 2015. Specifically, the District provided documents concerning a lawsuit filed in the United States District Court for the Western District of Arkansas captioned Davis, et al., v. Hot Springs School District, et al., Case No. 89-6088.

Based on the documentation provided, the Division has determined that the Lakeside School District is not required to participate in school choice under the Act, as participation would conflict with the terms of a federal court order.
