State Board Meeting
March 14, 2024**

The Arkansas State Board of Education (State Board) met Thursday, March 14, 2024. Dr. Sarah Moore called the meeting to order at 9:02 AM, followed by a moment of silence.

III.1. Lily Williams, Member of WorldSkills USA Team

Item III.1. was presented by Mr. Ross White, Director of Career and Technical Education.

A 2023 graduate of Northeast Arkansas Career and Technical Center in Jonesboro, Ms. Lily Williams won a national gold medal in the 2023 automotive refinishing SkillsUSA competition. In September 2024, Ms. Williams will represent the United States in the international WorldSkills competition to be held in Lyon, France.

III.2. United States Senate Youth Program (USSYP) Delegates

Ms. Stacy Smith, Deputy Commissioner, introduced Item III.2. and Ms. Amber Pirnique, Disciplinary Literacy Program Administrator. Item III.2. was presented by Ms. Amber Pirnique, who also recognized Ms. Ronda Smith for coordination of the Arkansas United States Senate Youth Program (USSYP).

Recognizing the importance of the School Breakfast Program, Governor Sarah Huckabee Sanders proclaimed March as School Breakfast Month on Tuesday, February 20, 2024. The purpose of this month-long celebration is to honor child nutrition teams and school personnel, as well as encourage school districts to increase school breakfast participation.

V.2. District Waiver Requests for Alternate School Calendar

Item V.2. was presented by Ms. Stacy Smith, Deputy Commissioner. School districts attended via Zoom.

Due to inclement weather in the state, 12 school districts are requesting the State Board to waive Ark. Code Ann. § 6-10-106(g) to allow a mid-year change from a traditional school calendar of 178 days to an alternative calendar of 1,068 hours.

A motion to grant a waiver of Arkansas Code Annotated § 6-10-106(g)(3) for the five (5) school districts that have submitted a full waiver petition, as it pertains to the July 1 deadline to notify the Arkansas Department of Education (ADE) and the August 1 deadline to post the alternate school calendar on their district website. The motion was made by Ms. Leigh Keener, seconded by Ms. Adrienne Woods. The motion unanimously passed.

A motion to grant a waiver of Arkansas Code Annotated § 6-10-106(g)(3), pending local school board approval, as it pertains to the July 1 deadline to notify the ADE and the August 1 deadline to post the alternate school calendar on their district website, for the seven school districts that have yet to submit their local school board resolution. The motion was made by Mr. Ken Bragg, seconded by Ms. Ms. Lisa Hunter. The motion unanimously passed.

V.3. District Waiver Requests for 2024-2025 School Start Date

Item V.2. was presented by Ms. Stacy Smith, Deputy Commissioner and Mr. Andres Rhodes, ADE Chief Legal Counsel. School districts attended via Zoom.

There are 35 school districts requesting a waiver of Ark. Code Ann. § 6-10-106 (a)(1)(A) which requires school districts to begin school on or after the Monday of the week in which August 19 falls and no earlier than August 14 or later than August 26.

A motion was made to grant for one year a waiver of Ark. Code Ann. § 6-10-106(a), the school start date, for 33 school districts that have submitted a full waiver petition. The motion was made by Ms. Leigh Keener, seconded by Mr. Ken Bragg. The motion unanimously passed.

A motion was made to grant for one year a waiver of Ark. Code Ann. § 6-10-106(a), the school start date, for Calico Rock School District and Concord School District pending submission of their local board resolution. The motion was made by Ms. Leigh Keener, seconded by Mr. Ken Bragg. The motion unanimously passed.

For the upcoming Fall, before legislative session, Dr. Moore requested Ms. Smith to submit to the State Board a list of school district start dates; reflecting whether the school district will be using an alternative calendar; and if using the alternative calendar with hours, the number of days are they going.
