REVIEW FINDINGS Meal Access and Reimbursement - Performance Standard 1 YES Technical Assistance Corrective Action NO Certification and Benefit Issuance **√** Verification Meal Counting and Claiming Charge Policy and Unpaid Meal Procedures Findings: 1) Of the 85 student eligibility source documents reviewed there were seventeen (17) applications missing the last four digits of the social security number. 2) High probability and low probability labeled students on the Direct Certification list are not being entered into the Direct Certification portal for confirmation. 3) Two (2) students were approved for free price eligibility but was listed as paid on the districts eSchool 4) The verification process was not completed by the federally mandated November 15 deadline. Final verification letters were mailed on December 3, 2018. As a result, the district will be placed on the "Standard Sample" list for verification in the 2019- 20 school year. Meal Patterns and Nutritional Quality YES NO Technical Assistance Corrective Action Meal Components and Quantities Offer versus Serve Dietary Specifications and Nutrient Analysis Findings: 1) The completion of the certification tool for the menu section of the review revealed: a. Four days of breakfast meals did not meet the federal meal pattern requirements for the grain contribution requirement. b. Based on production record documentation, there were a total of eight (8) meal options offered the entire week for lunch. One (1) out of the eight (8) meal options did not have information present to credit towards the meal pattern for the meat/meat alternate requirement. c. Five (5) out of the eight (8) meal options did not have information present to credit towards the

meal pattern for the grain requirement.

- d. Two (2) days of lunch meals did not meet the federal meal pattern requirements for the fruit contribution requirement. Based on production record documentation, no fruit was served on Tuesday or Thursday.
- e. Three (3) days of lunch meals did not meet the federal **9-12** meal pattern requirement for the vegetable contribution. Two (2) days of lunch meals did not meet the federal **K-8** meal pattern requirement for the vegetable contribution. A salad bar was observed during the week of review, however there is no documentation of a salad bar being served on the production records or a separate record to confirm what items are offered to the students each day.
- It is undetermined if the Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP) meal pattern is being followed.
  Preschool production records were not accurately completed in accordance with 7 CFR 210.10 (a)(3)

## Findings:

- 1) At the time of the review the 2018-19 On-Site Review had not been completed, as the deadline is not until February 1, 2019. However, the On-Site Review for the previous school year was not completed or available for review.
- 2) The district has a current Wellness Policy, however it has not been updated with the final requirements.
- 3) The Wellness Committee has not met during the 2018-19 school year.
- 4) Foods must be labeled and dated in storage (dry storage, coolers, and freezers) to ensure adherence to food safety standards in Arkansas State Board of Health Food Code 3-501.17.
- 5) Thermometer calibration records were not available for observation at the time of review.
- 6) On the day of breakfast observation, the proper procedure to ensure time and temperature food safety was not being followed specifically regarding the preschool meals.
- 7) Buy American justification forms were not accurately completed in accordance with 7 CFR 210.21(d) Procurement regulations.
- 8) Documentation of Summer Feeding outreach was not available at the time of review.
