Preschool students were served a noncompliant entrée. The glazed donut served is considered a grain based dessert and cannot count towards the grain component in the CACFP beginning October 1, 2017, as specified in 7 CFR 226.20 (a)(4) and 210.10. Therefore, the federal Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP) meal pattern requirements for the grain contribution requirements were not met. The CACFP breakfast minimum meal pattern requirement for grains is ½ oz equivalent. B. Based on production record documentation, only 1/2 cup fruit was served to preschool students. Findings:

- 1) While observing breakfast and lunch at Ringgold Elementary, a preschool teacher was separating her class by gender. Separation by gender during Child Nutrition Program Meal Service is prohibited under 7 CFR Parts 15.
- 2) Upon reviewing production record documentation, 84 snacks were prepared/sent on the days of the afterschool snack operation. These numbers were compared against the daily record counts for the corresponding days, which showed 49 on Tuesday and 52 on Thursday. The Child Nutrition Director communicated that no snacks are sent back to the cafeteria after the service of the program. Therefore, 35 snacks were missing from Tuesday and 32 were missing from Thursday. After observing the afterschool snack program and speaking with teachers, any snack items that are leftover either are thrown in the trash or kept.
