		the meal pattern. Some items were not credited correctly according to the CN label

		2) Offer vs Serve (OVS) was not being implemented correctly. OVS is a concept that applies to menu planning and the meal service. OVS allows students to decline some of the food offered in a reimbursable lunch or breakfast. The goals of OVS are to reduce food waste and to permit students to choose the foods they want to eat. The students in High School were being served items that were not eaten and thrown in the trash. If the items are already on the student's tray and the student does not have a method to decline the food item, OVS is not implemented correctly.
