The breakfast review only provided a 1/2 cup of fruit for the high school students. Another finding showed that previous meals from the month of September also only provided a ½ cup of fruit for high school student breakfasts. 2) The crediting for the hot wings and mini corn dogs indicated that each item did not contain no whole grain equivalent as previously indicated on production records. Any public releases must contain

the non-discrimination statement.

- 2) Wellness meetings were not held quarterly for the school year 2017-2018. There has been one (1) meeting held for the school year 2018-2019. Wellness meetings must be held quarterly every school year.
- 3) Student health indexes (SHI) for each school has not been completed for the school year 2018-2019. None were completed in 2017-2018. SHI's should be completed yearly.
- 4) Sparkling Ice drinks were sold through a la carte sales to grades 7-12. Per USDA Smart Snack regulations, if a middle/junior school and high school are in the same building, and all students have access to all venues in the school, the items available for sale to the students (beverages) must meet the middle school standards.
- 5) Professional standards state that all child nutrition workers must complete six (6) hours of training each year; all child nutrition managers must complete ten (10) hours; and child nutrition directors must complete (12) hours of training.
- 6) At the time of the review, it was found that food items that were produced outside of the United States, did not have a Buy American justification form.
- 7) Food safety and Offer Vs. Serve training has not been completed for the school year 2018-2019. Both trainings must be done each year.
- 8) A review of the afterschool snack program meal claim showed an inaccurate count of snacks served. 816 was the count on the September claim, however, only 772 students were counted according to the attendance/meal count records.
