- a. All five (5) days of breakfast meals did not meet the federal meal pattern for the fruit contribution requirement. Only ½ cup of fruit was offered daily. The breakfast daily fruit meal pattern minimum is 1 cup offered for grades K-5.
- b. One (1) of five (5) days of breakfast meals did not meet the federal meal pattern for the grain contribution requirement. All grains must be made with enriched and whole grain meal or flour. The current federal meal pattern requires all grains served to be at least 50% whole grain, which is considered whole grain rich. The breakfast daily grain meal pattern minimum is 1 oz served for grades K-5.
