- 2) Two a la carte beverages were identified during the review as being not compliant with SmartSnack calculator.
- 3) While observing storage, there was food products from Mexico without a Buy American Justification Form.
- 4) While reviewing the FSMC invoice for the school district, there was an over-claim of meals being charged to the district.
