Findings:				
1) Upon completion of the USDA Meal Certification Worksheets for the week of October 8-12, 2018, meals served 3 of the 5 days did not meet daily minimum requirement for vegetables in grades K – 5. The K - 5 lunch meal pattern minimum requirement is ¾ cup vegetable per day. On October 9 and 11, 5/8 cup of vegetable was offered. On October 12, ½ cup of vegetable was offered. The Meal Certification Worksheets also revealed that the weekly minimum requirement for vegetable subgroups dark green, beans/peas (legumes), and red/orange were not met.				
2) Observed on the day of review and on production records completed for the week of the review during the month of October the meals served at breakfast to Pre-K were not in compliance with the Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP) meal pattern. Students were being served cereal containing more than 6g of sugar. In addition, during the review period grain based desserts were served to Pre K students on two of five days reviewed.
