that were not accounted for in the Child Nutrition account. Further questions revealed that June claim was entered and taken out of child nutrition account for unknown reasons. Lunch reimbursements and PBR were later (Sept) put back in but not the				
breakfast reimbursement. The year-to-date balance for the breakfast account only showed the August reimbursement				
deposit.
