## THE ARKANSAS STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION

IN RE THE MATTER OF: BRENDA EUGENIA ROBERTSON OCTOBER 10, 2019

**PLSB CASE NO. 19-137** 

## FINDINGS OF FACT, CONCLUSIONS OF LAW, AND ORDER

At its regular meeting on October 10, 2019, the Arkansas State Board of Education (Board) accepted the recommendation of the Professional Licensure Standards Board Ethics Subcommittee (Ethics Subcommittee) for disciplinary action against the teaching license of Brenda Eugenia Robertson (Educator Robertson). Based upon Educator Robertson's failure to respond to the Ethics Subcommittee's recommendation and the evidence presented, in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act, Ark. Code Ann. 25-15-101 et seq., the Board hereby states as follows:

## I. Findings of Fact

- a. The Arkansas Department of Education issued Educator Robertson a standard fiveyear teaching license on January 1, 2016, valid until December 31, 2020.
- b. The Ethics Subcommittee received an allegation that Educator Robertson violated the Arkansas Department of Education Rules Governing the Code of Ethics for Arkansas Educators promulgated pursuant to Ark. Code Ann. § § 6-17-422 and 6-17-428.
- c. On June 1, 2018, the Ethics Subcommittee authorized an investigation into allegations that Educator Robertson violated Standard 1: an educator maintains a professional relationship with each student, both in and outside the classroom; and Standard 2: an educator maintains competence regarding his or her professional

- practice, inclusive of professional and ethical behavior, skills, knowledge, dispositions.
- d. Educator Robertson was notified on April 8, 2019, of the Ethics Subcommittee's authorization to investigate this allegation.
- e. After considering the investigator's report and evidence on July 31, 2019, the Ethics Subcommittee unanimously found that a preponderance of evidence existed to substantiate violation of Standards 1 and 2 in that Educator Robertson:
  - Made physical contact with a student.
  - Had inappropriate interactions with a student.
  - Exhibited an inappropriate disposition inclusive of professional and ethical behavior.
- f. The Ethics Subcommittee recommended that the State Board take the following actions:
  - 1. Probation of license for 1 year;
  - 2. Assess a \$200 fine (due within 30 days of the suspension end date);
  - 3. Require Educator to complete the following coursework/readings:
    - ERC19048: Professional Licensure Standards Board (PLSB): The Code of Ethics Training Video (2018); Credit Hours: 1
    - o IAE14017 The Learning Classroom: Feelings Count; Credit Hours: 1
    - O Title: Whole Brain Teaching for Challenging Kids: (and the rest of your class, too!) (292p); Author: Chris Biffle; ISBN-10: 0984816712; ISBN-13: 978-0984816712
  - 4. Require Educator to prepare written reflection: that explains how trainings and readings will influence her interactions with students in the future (due within 90 days of the State Board Order); and
  - 5. Require Educator to pay all associated costs.
- g. On August 1, 2019, Educator Robertson, was notified of the Ethics Subcommittee's reasonable belief determination and recommendation by certified and regular mail.

Educator Robertson failed to respond to the Ethics Subcommittee's recommendation thereby waiving her right to any further notice, hearing, or any other rights she may have under the Administrative Procedure Act, including those rights set forth in Ark. Code Ann. §§ 25-15-211 and 25-15-212.

h. At today's meeting, the Ethics Subcommittee's recommendation and supporting documentation were presented to the Board as part of its consent agenda.

## II. Conclusions of Law

- a. Upon consideration of the evidence presented at the meeting, Ark. Code Ann. §§ 6-11-105, 6-17-401, 6-17-422, 6-17-428 and 25-15-201 et seq., and the Arkansas Department of Education Rules Governing the Code of Ethics for Arkansas Educators, the Board adopts the Ethics Subcommittee's recommendations, and enacts the sanctions accordingly. The Board admonishes Educator Brenda Eugenia Robertson for her violation of the Code of Ethics.
- b. Educator Robertson is cautioned that her non-payment of the assessed fine of \$200 will result in the continued suspension of her license until the fine is paid in full.
- c. Educator Robertson is cautioned that further violations of the Code of Ethics or failure to pay the fine within ninety (90) days from the date of this order may result in more severe discipline including permanent revocation of her license.
- d. This order shall remain permanently in Educator Robertson's professional licensure file and the confidential files of the Professional Licensure Standards Board.
