FINDINGS OF FACT, CONCLUSIONS OF LAW AND ORDER

At its regular meeting on October 12, 2017, the Arkansas State Board of Education (Board) accepted the surrender and revocation of the license of Jessie Lorene Goline (Educator Goline). The Board finds that the voluntary surrender of Educator Goline's license should be acknowledged and her license should be permanently revoked in accordance with the Administrative Procedures Act, Ark. Code Ann. § 25-15-101 et seq. The Board hereby states as follows:

I. Findings of Fact


- a. The Arkansas Department of Education issued Jessie Lorene Goline a standard five-year teaching license on August 5, 2015, valid until December 31, 2019.
- b. The Professional Licensure Standards Board Ethics Subcommittee (Ethics Subcommittee) received an allegation that Educator Goline violated the Arkansas Department of Education rules Governing the Code of Ethics for Arkansas Educators (Code of Ethics) promulgated pursuant to Ark. Code Ann. §§6-17-422 and 6-17-428.
- c. On July 10, 2017, the Ethics Subcommittee authorized an investigation into the allegation that Educator Goline violated Standard 1: An educator maintains a professional relationship with each student, both in and outside the classroom.

- d. On July 13, 2017, Educator Goline was notified of the Ethics Subcommittee's authorization to investigate the allegation that she:
- Engaged in Standard 1 sexual abuse of a student as defined by Ark. Code Ann. § 6-17-428 (p);
 - Engaged in inappropriate electronic communication with a student, and sent the student a sexually explicit photograph; and
 - Admitted to having sex with four (4) students.
- e. On July 27, 2017, Educator Goline voluntarily surrendered her license with the understanding that Arkansas law does not have a provision for the mere surrender of a license and, therefore, the surrender of a license will result in its permanent revocation.
- f. Educator Goline has waived her right to any notice, hearing, and any other rights she might be entitled to under the Administrative Procedure Act, including those set forth in Ark. Code Ann. §§ 25-15-211 and 212.
- g. Educator Goline's surrender is evidenced by the signed consent attached to this order.

II. Conclusions of Law

- a. The Administrative Procedure Act, Ark. Code Ann. § 25-15-208 (b), provides for the resolution of this matter by consent order.
- b. The Board voted unanimously to accept the surrender of Educator Goline's license.
- c. This order shall remain permanently in Educator Goline's professional licensure file and the confidential files of the Professional Licensure Standards Board.

CONSENT TO THE PERMANENT REVOCATION
OF MY ARKANSAS EDUCATOR'S LICENSEPlease initial each statement

1. JG I, JESSIE GOLINE, voluntarily surrender my Arkansas educator's license and any right to apply for renewal.
2. JG I understand that an educator's license means a teaching license and/or an administrator's license.
3. JG I acknowledge and understand that I cannot apply for an educator's license in Arkansas at any time in the future.
4. JG I shall not apply for an educator's license in Arkansas at any time in the future.
5. JG I acknowledge and understand that an educator's license shall not be issued to me at any time in the future.
6. JG I acknowledge and understand that the State Board of Education's acceptance of the surrender of my educator's license will result in its PERMANENT REVOCATION because Arkansas law has no provision for the mere surrender of an educator's license.
7. JG I acknowledge and understand that the Department of Education reports revocation of an educator's license to the NASDTEC Clearinghouse, which is a national database consulted by other states' licensure units.
8. JG I waive all rights I may have to any further notice, hearing, or appeal under the Arkansas Administrative Procedures Act, Ark. Code Ann. § 25-15-101 et seq.
9. I am not JG represented by legal counsel in this matter.
