

The Hoxie School District proposes to establish a conversion charter school, Hoxie High School Academies, to better increase the college and career readiness of all students enrolled at Hoxie High School. For students in grade seven and eight, college and career readiness will become a capstone unit for all career orientation classes. This would expose access and pathways to our students to local colleges, such as Black River Technical College and Williams Baptist College. In grades nine through twelve, we will begin to offer more concurrent credit courses to expand our secondary and career and technology centers to share infrastructure and resources. The Hoxie High School Academies will offer additional opportunities students in technical and vocational curriculum areas, utilizing a personalized method of instruction that incorporates individualized and digital curriculum delivery, designed to provide students with career certification as well as a high school diploma. The charter school will provide a full, rich academic curriculum to its students, augmented by superior vocation skills offerings, to ensure its graduates will leave the district fully prepared for entry into institutions of higher education or immediate entry into the workforce with highly marketable training and skills.
