how the school expects to operate.

Partially Meets the Standard: The response addresses most of the criteria, but response lacks

meaningful detail and requires important additional information.

Does Not Meet the Standard: The response lacks meaningful detail, demonstrates lack of

preparation, or otherwise raises substantial concerns about the applicant's understanding of the issue in concept and/or ability to

meet the requirement in practice.

Math and Literacy teachers are piloting some elements such as: using scales and working with students to set learning goals. Brunson is still in a grade-based/time-based system at this time.

[sic] ("Teacher license requirement"), 6-17-902 ("Arkansas Teachers' Salary Law Definition"), and 6-17-919(a)(1) ("Warrants void without valid certificate and contract"); Standard 15.03 of the Standards for Accreditation ("Licensure and renewal"); ADE Rules Governing Waivers for Substitute Teachers; and ADE Rules Governing Parental Notification of an Assignment of a Non-Licensed Teacher: It is presumed the reference to 6-17-01 is in fact a reference to Ark. Code Ann. §§ 6-17-401 et seq.
 - Even if Applicant is granted a waiver from the licensure requirements, the Applicant will still be required by federal law to hire only Highly Qualified teachers in core academic subject areas (English Language Arts, Reading, Mathematics, Science, Foreign Languages, Social Studies, Music, and Art). Any teacher who teaches a core academic subject area must meet the requirements of the ADE Rules Governing Highly Qualified Teachers, except for the licensure requirement.

Brunson New Vision Charter School will follow federal requirements regarding hiring Highly Qualified teachers in core academic subject areas.

• The ADE Rules Governing the Arkansas Comprehensive Testing Assessment and Accountability Program, Sections 5.02.4 and 5.03.2, requires that standardized assessments be administered according to procedures established by the ADE. The ADE's procedures require that certified teachers administer the standardized assessments. Violations of such procedures are subject to sanctions by the State Board pursuant to Ark. Code Ann. § 6-15-438.

Brunson New Vision Charter School will follow state requirements in allowing only licensed teachers to administer standardized assessments.

 All teachers and school personnel must submit to the criminal background and central registry checks.

Brunson New Vision Charter School will follow regulations requiring all school personnel to submit to criminal background and central registry checks.

• It is noted that the Applicant has not requested waiver of Ark. Code Ann. § 6-17-302, requiring the school to have a properly licensed principal.

Brunson New Vision Charter School does not wish to waive the requirement to have a properly licensed principal.

Strengths: Application contains a copy of the proposed certified and classified salary schedule.

Concerns and Additional Questions:

The applicant should clarify how calculation of Federal revenue for year 1 & year 2.

Pgs. H-1 & H-5

The amount listed equals the amount budgeted for federal salaries, benefits, and other. We budgeted enough revenue to cover it exactly. It is based upon current FTE's paid from Federal funds.

Applicant should clarify fringe benefit rate budgeted. Percentages are inconsistent throughout the budget.

Pgs. H-1 through H-12

Year 1: 22% + \$2,325 per licensed FTE and \$2,253 per classified FTE. Year 2: 22% + \$2,370 per licensed FTE and \$2,297 per classified FTE.

Health Services budgeted at .15 FTE, but staffing plan references .33 FTE. Please clarify.

Pgs.H-2 & H-6

Paula Church, nurse, is .15 FTE at Brunson (2 grades out of 13).

Applicant should clarify what is included in Purchased services under Maintenance and Operation. It cannot be determined if insurance is accounted for.

Pgs. H-3 & H-7

Insurance is not broken down by campus.

Applicant did not include allocated cost for Fiscal Services or Pupil transportation. Please clarify.

Pgs. H-3 & H-7

District covers the costs.

Food Services budgeted for 2.4 FTEs, but staffing plan referenced 3. Please clarify.

Pgs. H-3 & H-7

There is one kitchen that serves Brunson and Warren Middle School. There is one cafeteria manager who serves both schools. Warren Middle School has more grades, therefore, she is assigned .4 at Brunson and .6 at WMS.

Applicant did not budget food cost. Please clarify.

Pgs. H-3 & H-7

Food costs are not broken down by school.

Applicant should clarify amount budgeted for substitutes

Pgs. H-4 & H-8

We are contracting substitute teachers as a purchased service through SubTeach USA.

Applicant should clarify the additional teacher under Regular Classroom Instruction in the addendum. It cannot be determined when compared to the staffing plan.

Pgs. H-9 & H-11

Amy Cortright is paid from Title I. She is a 5th grade literacy teacher.

Applicant should clarify FTE budgeted for Speech Therapist at .25 FTE. The staffing plan references .2 FTE. Pgs. H-9 & H-11

The Speech Therapist is budgeted by Special Education Supervisors at .25 per campus. (The staffing plan should say .25 as well.)

Applicant should clarify the 1 FTE budgeted for Interventionist/Teacher Aides. The staffing plan references 1 PART-TIME certified interventionist. Pgs. H-10 & H-12

The staffing plan should say 1 FTE Interventionist. (That position was filled recently by a retired teacher using NSLA funding and in the future is contingent upon NSLA allocations.)
