L6	is for you guys to decide if you would like to call
L7	any of the charter schools before you based on their
L8	previous academic performance, which we discussed
L9	during the work session.
20	CHAIRPERSON PFEFFER: Okay. So in our work
21	session this morning everyone you got a lot of
22	information. You've been able to look at some data
23	and we did discuss that next month there are some of
24	our charters coming in for renewals. So I think you
25	have a list of those open-enrollment and district

conversion charters that will be coming in for renewals. So there will be an opportunity then to review some information. But at this time if there are others that we feel like maybe need to be called in for consideration we can go ahead and make that motion to do that. And I believe if that were the case we would be looking at trying for them to come in January. Is that right, Dr. Boyd?

DR. BOYD: Yes, that's correct. We would -- if you would like to see someone, you would talk about the information that you would like from the school today. And we would draft a letter to send to the school to put them on notice, and they have to have at least 35 days. So we'd be more comfortable with having them come in January, because that would give them more time to prepare in response to the questions that you have.

And I just sent you a link to voting sheets in the case that you would need them for this action item. But we did not have them for the previous items.

DR. WILLIAMS: I have a question.

DR. BOYD: Uh-huh.

DR. WILLIAMS: Dr. Boyd, for the schools with an F, were you all going to -- I don't see necessarily

that we need to bring all of them in in January. So
do you all have a plan to reach out to the schools
and see what's going on and then bring something back
to us, the ones you-all think we need to visit with?

DR. BOYD: So the schools that have -- the schools that do have an F letter grade have also been identified for some other type of support. So they are getting support from the Department for one reason or another.

DR. WILLIAMS: Okay.

DR. BOYD: If you would like, we could prepare a report for you about what that support -- what the plan for that support is. I don't know that we would have any results for you, you know, within the month or two. But we could possibly do that.

DR. WILLIAMS: I think that would just be helpful for us, especially if we request -- and I'm not requesting any at this moment. But if we request any to come in, it would be good to know what's already being done, what work is already -- or what the plan is to work with them already.

CHAIRPERSON PFEFFER: So, Dr. Boyd, can I -- and just going back and looking at the data you all gave us, it appears that there were -- is it correct -- four --

9	closed, so there's so that leaves three that are
10	operating right now that have F's.
11	CHAIRPERSON PFEFFER: Well, I think
12	DR. HERNANDEZ: Blytheville
13	CHAIRPERSON PFEFFER: Blytheville
14	DR. HERNANDEZ: and the two Lighthouses.
15	CHAIRPERSON PFEFFER: Yeah. So if you include
16	the Blytheville New Tech that would make four. Is
17	that correct?
18	DR. BOYD: I believe it's Blytheville, Capital
19	City, and Pine Bluff Lighthouse.
20	CHAIRPERSON PFEFFER: Oh, okay. I'm sorry.
21	DR. BOYD: Am I missing one?
22	CHAIRPERSON PFEFFER: Yeah. No, I was looking
23	at Quest.
24	DR. BOYD: Yeah. And they're closed.
25	CHAIRPERSON PFEFFER: Yes. Okay. And then Pine

1	Bluff Lighthouse will be coming in next month?
2	DR. BOYD: For renewal. Yes.
3	CHAIRPERSON PFEFFER: For renewal.
4	DR. BOYD: They're for renewal.
5	CHAIRPERSON PFEFFER: So we will already be
6	looking at the Pine Bluff Lighthouse. So really
7	there would only be two other schools with a letter
8	grade of an F, should the Panel decide to go ahead
9	and bring them in. Is that correct?
10	DR. BOYD: That's correct.
11	DR. HERNANDEZ: So do we just make a motion to
12	that effect?
13	CHAIRPERSON PFEFFER: Uh-huh.
14	DR. HERNANDEZ: I make a motion that we bring
15	in, in January, for review I lost it Capital
16	City Lighthouse and Blytheville New Tech Charter.
17	CHAIRPERSON PFEFFER: We have a motion.
18	MR. ROGERS: Second.
19	CHAIRPERSON PFEFFER: Okay. I have a motion and
20	a second to bring in Capital City Lighthouse and
21	Blytheville New Tech Charter.
22	Okay. Any discussion?
23	All those in favor say "aye."
24	(UNANIMOUS CHORUS OF AYES)
25	CHAIRPERSON PFEFFER: Any opposed?

1	Okay. The motion passes. So those two charters
2	will be asked to come in.
3	DR. BOYD: I'm sorry. I missed who the second
4	was.
5	DR. KREMERS: Blytheville.
6	DR. BOYD: Okay. Got it.
7	DR. HERNANDEZ: So do we need to give them any
8	specifics other than we just want to talk about their
9	ESSA School Index?
10	DR. BOYD: Yes. In the past when you've asked
11	for a review you panel members explained what it
12	was that they wanted to talk about kind of
13	specifically so that the applicant could prepare
14	written material and also their presentation based on
15	what you wanted to know.
16	CHAIRPERSON PFEFFER: And we talked about I
17	know that Blytheville had come in a year ago as part
18	of their renewal. But how long has it been since
19	Capital City
20	DR. BOYD: They haven't been in; so they're
21	still on their initial five-year charter. They're up
22	for renewal next year. So to my knowledge, they have
23	not been before the Panel for review.
24	CHAIRPERSON PFEFFER: Since we have new members
25	on this panel and I know that, you know, maybe

1	were here for the Blytheville part, but we actually
2	well, no, wouldn't have been here for the
3	Blytheville part. It may be helpful for both of
4	those to kind of revisit what the mission and goals
5	are, but then get I think well, I'm going to let
6	the panel members go first and then I'll go through
7	and kind of specify what I would want to see.
8	So we'll start with Mr. Rogers. What are you
9	what are some of your specific questions?
10	MR. ROGERS: I don't even what their plan is
11	I mean, how are they looking at correcting this.
12	They went from a D to an F this year. And so what
13	support have they received from ADE, how are they
14	using that support, and how do they intend to improve
15	going forward. And I hadn't looked at these on the
16	financial side either, but I would like to before
17	they come in. But I haven't looked at it, so I don't
18	know if that's fair.
19	CHAIRPERSON PFEFFER: So would your office be
20	able to look to see if there are any financial
21	MR. ROGERS: Yes.
22	CHAIRPERSON PFEFFER: concerns and to
23	communicate that in advance to them
24	MR. ROGERS: Yes.
25	CHAIRPERSON PFEFFER: and

2	CHAIRPERSON PFEFFER: Okay. Dr. Hernandez, do
3	you have
4	DR. HERNANDEZ: Just kind of to frame out Greg's
5	a little more on the academic side, I just want to
6	see have some discussion around their school level
7	plans and how those plans are addressing their letter
8	score, their ESSA School Index basically.
9	CHAIRPERSON PFEFFER: Dr. Kremers?
10	DR. KREMERS: Kind of similar response.
11	MR. WILSON: Mine too.
12	CHAIRPERSON PFEFFER: Dr. Williams, do you have
13	some specifics that you would like?
14	DR. WILLIAMS: The only thing I would like to
15	add is I would like to know from their perspective
16	what has contributed to the decline, you know, and
17	I'm back to factual circumstances. You know, it may
18	have been that they had a class of students that came
19	in that were already behind that kind of pulled them
20	down some. But just really same thing that Mr.
21	Rogers and Dr. Hernandez said, along with their
22	thoughts on how did they get where they are.
23	CHAIRPERSON PFEFFER: Okay. And I think we all
24	kind of are thinking alike. Just a clear
25	communication that they fully understand their

1	performance in its entirety with the ESSA School
2	Index and letter grades, that they're able to go
3	through and articulate specifically what it is that
4	they are doing. And I think we will have to look at
5	the program in its entirety
6	DR. BOYD: Okay.
7	CHAIRPERSON PFEFFER: as we make decisions.
8	So, okay.
9	So do we need to go into the Google Doc and
10	record our voting with this or
11	DR. BOYD: For this one, so the voting sheets
12	are usually for so that the State Board can know
13	why you decided to do something. But I don't think
14	this is this one, this vote doesn't go before the
15	State Board.
16	CHAIRPERSON PFEFFER: For review. Okay.
17	DR. BOYD: So I don't think it's necessary.
18	CHAIRPERSON PFEFFER: Okay. Okay. So, Panel,
19	we've made that decision.
20	In looking at well, thinking about what we
21	discussed earlier, one of the things that we had
22	talked about today was working with or deciding if
23	there were some priority things we might want the

Charter Office to consider. Do you have any thoughts

as far as any maybe directions that we would give to

1	the Charter Office that might help in them bringing
2	us information back over the next few months?
3	MR. WILSON: In general?
4	CHAIRPERSON PFEFFER: About yes, about
5	overall performance. So
6	DR. WILLIAMS: I would like to maybe get some
7	additional information on the breakdown and the
8	criteria that's used for the ESSA scores.
9	DR. BOYD: You mean like what we discussed
10	during the work session?
11	DR. WILLIAMS: Yes.
12	DR. BOYD: All right. I got it.
13	CHAIRPERSON PFEFFER: So, Dr. Boyd, would that
14	be kind of maybe a report that we might put together
15	
16	DR. BOYD: Uh-huh.
17	CHAIRPERSON PFEFFER: do you think?
18	Okay.
19	DR. BOYD: Uh-huh. Yeah, I could put a report
20	together for that. And I can put that along with
21	your January agenda. Is that the expectation? Do
22	you want it in January or do you want it in December?
23	DR. WILLIAMS: Oh, I'm open to the pleasure of
24	the board.
25	DR. BOYD: I think I can get you a better

2	CHAIRPERSON PFEFFER: Okay.
3	DR. WILLIAMS: I'm good with January.
4	CHAIRPERSON PFEFFER: Just trying to think
5	proactively going forward, there are a number of
6	schools on the list, both open-enrollment and
7	district conversion charters, that have had a letter
8	grade of D for two consecutive years. In just trying
9	to think proactively in trying to help the Charter
10	Office prioritize maybe some things, since we're
11	going to bring those schools with an F in and we're
12	going to be able to hear and do a review of those
13	schools, would it be do you have thoughts on maybe
14	putting that as a priority for the Charter Unit to
15	maybe start with those school districts that have had
16	two consecutive years of a D letter grade to touch
17	base with
18	MR. WILSON: Sure.
19	CHAIRPERSON PFEFFER: and see how many
20	there are quite a few. I haven't actually counted,
21	but
22	MR. WILSON: I mean, it's entirely proper that
23	the Charter Office make contact with those that
24	perhaps are not already being assisted by ADE
25	CHAIRPERSON PFEFFER: Yeah. It looks like

1 there's at least --MR. WILSON: -- to find out what their plans 2 3 are. CHAIRPERSON PFEFFER: -- at least eight that I 4 can just glance through. So, and that may be in the 5 form of reviewing their school level plans with them, 6 7 you know, just walking through, making sure they're 8 fully understanding all the components of the ESSA 9 School Index. So would we need to do a motion for that if that was something we wanted the --10 11 DR. BOYD: Huh-uh. 12 CHAIRPERSON PFEFFER: Okay. 13 DR. BOYD: You just want a -- so you want to make sure that we're talking to the schools. 14 15 there anything that you want us to produce for you? 16 MR. ROGERS: Going back to what Dr. Williams --I'd like to have the discrepancies between the 17 18 graduation rate and reading level. I just really --I know I keep saying reading level, but I think 19 20 that's one of the most important things. And if you 21 have a high graduation rate but your reading level is 22 not very high, I think that's a problem. 23 CHAIRPERSON PFEFFER: Dr. Boyd, would it be

those schools by January?

feasible for you all to have made contact with all of

DR. BOYD: Uh-huh.

CHAIRPERSON PFEFFER: And I know maybe Mr.

Ballard may be the one who would need to answer some of these questions. But if you're going to do a report, what Mr. Rogers is asking about may be appropriate for the report maybe a report in January also on as you touch base with these schools and are there further concerns that maybe the Panel might need to investigate. Because the earlier we can be having conversations that's better for students in that school should any decision have to be made.

MR. BALLARD: Okay. We'll get started on that.

I've been jotting it down. I just need

clarification. Because I noted earlier that you're

interested in the reading scores, and definitely

doing a comparison between that and graduation rates,

as well as touching base with some of those schools

that need to be identified?

MR. ROGERS: (Nodding head up and down.)

DR. BOYD: And so just for clarification, so the expectation is that the Charter Unit reach out to the schools. And then is there anything -- are you wanting just details about the responses, like if there are trends, or do you just want to know that we've been talking to them?

CHAIRPERSON PFEFFER: I think maybe just update that, you know, you have been able to, and if there's any follow-up or concerns that you have after that. So maybe just kind of a summary at this time. I think what that will do is, you know, provide us with some of the baseline data going forward then --

DR. BOYD: Gotcha.

CHAIRPERSON PFEFFER: -- should there be future concerns.

DR. BOYD: I gotcha.

CHAIRPERSON PFEFFER: But I'm open to any thoughts or suggestions from you all as far as what you would want to know.

MR. WILSON: That's fine.

DR. KREMERS: Do we normally consider, you know, just like a point -- say if there's a change in the ESSA index score that's greater than 10, do we want to have a report on kind of what potentially could be happening with that potential school, like expansion or -- because we have a few that are, you know, like the 12, 18, 10 -- and there's not a lot of them. And it may be just those situations where it's a quick thing and this is why. But it seems like if you're over 10 that really stands out as an outlier; you're on the other end of the Bell curve at that point.

1	DR. BOYD: Yeah. What I'm thinking about that
2	is that I think with the report that we're going to
3	give you in January that that can we can talk
4	about that, and then we can see if we need to
5	DR. KREMERS: Do anything further?
6	DR. BOYD: Yeah. And if 10 is the right number
7	or if there's another number.
8	DR. KREMERS: Okay. Okay.
9	CHAIRPERSON PFEFFER: Okay. Anything further
10	that panel members see the need for investigation, or
11	questions?
12	DR. BOYD: Just a quick I just scanned over
13	those that have higher than 10, and all of them are
14	schools that have significantly expanded.
15	DR. KREMERS: Okay.
16	DR. BOYD: But I will we'll still look at it
17	and give you a number that we think might be a cut-
18	off.
19	DR. KREMERS: Okay.
20	CHAIRPERSON PFEFFER: Because it would be
21	helpful to know if in those schools that are
22	expanding are there and this may be kind of what
23	Dr. Williams has alluded to are there certain
24	things that all of them have in common.
25	DR. BOYD: Right.

1	CHAIRPERSON PFEFFER: Is it that their
2	achievement significantly dropped or did they all
3	show lower growth? You know, what are some of those
4	things? Because, again, the more we know then the
5	more maybe we can be proactively working with schools
6	when they're expanding grades or looking at
7	components of the accountability system.
8	DR. BOYD: Uh-huh.
9	CHAIRPERSON PFEFFER: Okay. I think that will
10	be helpful.
11	CLOSING COMMENTS
12	CHAIRPERSON PFEFFER: Okay. Well, that was the
13	final item on our action agenda. So, Dr. Boyd, do we
14	have anything else that has come up?
15	DR. BOYD: No, ma'am. That's all we have.
16	CHAIRPERSON PFEFFER: Okay. All right. So if
17	we have nothing else, our next meeting is in
18	December, two days of renewals. Is that correct?
19	DR. BOYD: Uh-huh. Yes. On the 18th we'll do
20	the open-enrollment renewals, and then on the 19th
21	we'll do the district conversion renewals. And then
22	we have a couple of amendment requests that have come
23	up. And I think most of I think there's just one
24	you may have two but they are a result of the
25	Standards for Accreditation and schools realizing

1	that they need a few more waivers that they didn't
2	previously have that they're going to have to ask for
3	approval to have.
4	CHAIRPERSON PFEFFER: Okay. All right. So
5	December will be a busy month.
6	DR. BOYD: Uh-huh.
7	CHAIRPERSON PFEFFER: And then we will have the
8	other two schools that will be coming in January, so
9	
10	DR. BOYD: And I also just want to thank
11	everyone for making time those of you who made
12	time to visit schools that are up for renewal. I
13	really appreciate it. And we have about a month to
14	get the rest in that haven't been done. So thank you
15	for taking the time out to do that. I know you guys
16	are already really busy.
17	CHAIRPERSON PFEFFER: And that's always good for
18	us to get to get out there and see that; so I know
19	some of you will have some good stuff to share next
20	month.
21	DR. WILLIAMS: A quick question Dr. Boyd,
22	there are no schools in northwest Arkansas, are
23	there?
24	DR. BOYD: None that are renewing. No, sir.
25	DR. WILLIAMS: I just wanted to be sure.
