I hope this letter finds you well. KIPP Delta is seeking an expedited charter amendment request that allows KIPP Delta to expand its schools in Blytheville to serve students in Kindergarten – third grade. Our Blytheville campusese are currently approved to serve students in grades 4-12 with a maximum enrollment of 810. Our desire is to expand to K-12 with a maximum enrollment of 1,100 beginning in the 2018-2019 school year. We are seeking an expedited approval outside of the normal process because there are several advantageous financing options that are contingent upon this approval. An October approval would significantly delay the approval of these loans. In July, we plan to submit a request for the associated debt.

Ms. Alexandra Boyd, Director of the Public Charter Schools Office, advised that we reach out to you to waive ADE Rules Governing Public Charter Schools section 4.02.3 in accordance with ADE Rules Governing Public Charter Schools section 4.02.7 and allow us to present our amendment request at the July 19, 2017 Charter Authorizing Panel meeting. Please let this letter serve as our official request for you to grant the necessary approvals to allow KIPP Delta to present on July 19th.







Desegregation Analysis

KIPP Blytheville College Preparatory School (KIPP Blytheville) is requesting an amendment to authorize it to change its grade levels from 4-12 to K-12, and to increase its enrollment cap from 810 students to a maximum enrollment cap of 1,100 students beginning in the 2018-2019 school year at its two (2) Blytheville campuses. KIPP Blytheville will continue to comply with all applicable federal and state statutory and regulatory requirements regarding the creation and maintenance of desegregated public schools.

KIPP Blytheville should continue to have no negative impact on the ability or the efforts of the BSD or any other Arkansas public school districts to comply with any existing court orders or statutory obligations to create and maintain a unitary system of desegregated public schools. The BSD has not submitted information to the Arkansas Department of Education (ADE) stating that it is a party to active desegregation lawsuits. Based upon its careful review pursuant to Ark. Code Ann. §6-23-106, KIPP Blytheville does not believe that the granting of its requested amendment will hamper, delay or in any way negatively affect the desegregation efforts of the BSD.

KIPP Blytheville will continue to comply with all federal and state laws concerning enrollment in a public school and in particular those laws specified to enrollment in a public charter school. The current (June 7, 2017) student population of KIPP Blytheville is 348 students in grade levels 4-11 (12th grade will be added in the 2017-2018 school year). The 2016-2017 school year student population of the BSD as maintained by the ADE Data Center is 2,111 students. KIPP Blytheville's student population is approximately 16.5% of the BSD student population.

KIPP Blytheville realizes it cannot exclude any student that may wish to attend due to race, gender, ethnicity, or any other prohibited reason. No conclusion can be inferred or drawn against KIPP Blytheville that there exists any intent to continue to operate a public school, by way of this amendment request, or in practice, that has a purpose or intent to create a racially segregated public school or likewise impact other public schools.

SUBJECT: Desegregation Analysis of Amendment Request for Kipp Delta - Blytheville

I. INTRODUCTION

Kipp Delta of Blytheville is an open-enrollment charter school located in within the boundaries of the Blytheville School District (BSD). The school is approved to serve grades four through twelve (4-12) with an enrollment cap of 810 at the Blytheville campus. Kipp Delta Blytheville is requesting to expand its grades to serve students in grades kindergarten through third (K-3). Kipp Delta Blytheville also requests an enrollment increase from 810 to 1100 to accommodate the additional grades.

II. STATUTORY REQUIREMENTS

Although Ark. Code Ann. § 6-23-106 requires the authorizer to carefully analyze the impact of any new proposed charter school on the efforts of public school districts to achieve and maintain unitary systems, it does not require the authorizer to conduct an analysis of proposed amendments to an existing charter. However, Ark. Code Ann. § 6-23-106(c) states that the State Board "shall not approve any ... act or any combination of acts that hampers, delays, or in any manner negatively affects the desegregation efforts of a public school district or public school districts in this state."

III. INFORMATION SUBMITTED BY THE APPLICANT AND THE AFFECTED SCHOOL DISTRICT

A desegregation analysis submitted by the charter school is attached as Exhibit A. To date, no desegregation-related opposition to the charter amendment has been received.

IV. DATA FROM THE DEPARTMENT

The October 1, 2016, enrollment for the traditional public school districts in Mississippi County is as follows:

IV. ANALYSIS FROM THE DEPARTMENT

"Desegregation" is the process by which a school district eliminates, to the extent practicable, the lingering negative effects or "vestiges" of prior *de jure* (caused by official action) racial discrimination. The goal of a desegregation case with regard to assignment of students to schools is to "achieve a system of determining admission to the public schools on a non-racial basis." *Pasadena City Board of Education v. Spangler*, 427 U.S. 424, 435 (1976) (*quoting Brown v. Board of Education*, 349 U.S. 294, 300-301 (1955)).

The ADE is unaware of any active desegregation orders applicable to the Armorel, Blytheville, Gosnell, Manila, Osceola, or Rivercrest school districts, and no desegregation-related opposition was received from any of the affected school districts.

V. CONCLUSION

As stated above, Arkansas law does not allow the authorizer to approve any public charter school that "hampers, delays, or in any manner negatively affects the desegregation efforts" of a public school district. Ark. Code Ann. § 6-23-106(c). The Supreme Court noted in *Missouri v. Jenkins*, 515 U.S. 70, 115 (1995):

[I]n order to find unconstitutional segregation, we require that plaintiffs "prove all of the essential elements of *de jure* segregation -- that is, stated

simply, a current condition of segregation resulting from *intentional state action directed specifically* to the [allegedly segregated] schools." *Keyes v. School Dist. No. 1, 413 U.S. 189, 205-206 (1973)* (emphasis added). "[T]he differentiating factor between *de jure* segregation and so-called *de facto* segregation . . . is purpose or *intent* to segregate." *Id.,* at 208 (emphasis in original).

It is difficult to conclude, from data currently available, that the proposal of the charter school is motivated by an impermissible intent to segregate schools, or that approval would hamper, delay or negatively affect the desegregation efforts of the affected school districts.

Desegregation Analysis

KIPP Blytheville College Preparatory School (KIPP Blytheville) is requesting an amendment to authorize it to change its grade levels from 4-12 to K-12, and to increase its enrollment cap from 810 students to a maximum enrollment cap of 1,100 students beginning in the 2018-2019 school year at its two (2) Blytheville campuses. KIPP Blytheville will continue to comply with all applicable federal and state statutory and regulatory requirements regarding the creation and maintenance of desegregated public schools.

KIPP Blytheville should continue to have no negative impact on the ability or the efforts of the BSD or any other Arkansas public school districts to comply with any existing court orders or statutory obligations to create and maintain a unitary system of desegregated public schools. The BSD has not submitted information to the Arkansas Department of Education (ADE) stating that it is a party to active desegregation lawsuits. Based upon its careful review pursuant to Ark. Code Ann. §6-23-106, KIPP Blytheville does not believe that the granting of its requested amendment will hamper, delay or in any way negatively affect the desegregation efforts of the BSD.

KIPP Blytheville will continue to comply with all federal and state laws concerning enrollment in a public school and in particular those laws specified to enrollment in a public charter school. The current (June 7, 2017) student population of KIPP Blytheville is 348 students in grade levels 4-11 (12th grade will be added in the 2017-2018 school year). The 2016-2017 school year student population of the BSD as maintained by the ADE Data Center is 2,111 students. KIPP Blytheville's student population is approximately 16.5% of the BSD student population.

KIPP Blytheville realizes it cannot exclude any student that may wish to attend due to race, gender, ethnicity, or any other prohibited reason. No conclusion can be inferred or drawn against KIPP Blytheville that there exists any intent to continue to operate a public school, by way of this amendment request, or in practice, that has a purpose or intent to create a racially segregated public school or likewise impact other public schools.
