# Findings:

- 1) Upon review of a statistically valid sample of 328 source documents, the following errors were found:
  - a. The SFA's online application software contained an internal calculation error that resulted in applications with income frequencies of "two times per month" to be calculated as "every two weeks".

This error resulted in:

- i. eight applications determined as free when they should have been reduced, and
- ii. four applications determined as reduced when they should have been paid.
- b. Two benefit issuance errors occurred where applications were correctly calculated, but the eligibility was incorrectly recorded in the benefit issuance system.

This error resulted in:

- i. one student recorded as free and should have been paid, and
- ii. one student recorded as free and should have been reduced.
- 2) 2019 verification was incorrectly completed.
  - a. Tracking forms did not include the confirming official's signatures.
  - b. Verification was not completed by the November 15 due date. (Notification letters were mailed to households on November 18.)
  - c. One verification application did not include the required written evidence to verify a child income source but was accepted by the district.
- 3) Upon review of the September meal counts, it was discovered that one lunch meal count was omitted from the September edit check at the Jr. High School. This resulted in an underclaim of 164 free meals during the review month.

# Findings:

- 1) Completion of the USDA Certification sheets for the week of review determined several meal pattern requirements were not met at the Jr. High School. The SFA did not meet the following 7 CFR 210.10, Meal Pattern Requirements:
  - **a.** Grade 9 did not meet the daily 2 oz eq grain requirement during two breakfast meals, nor was the weekly 8-10 oz eq grain requirement met.
  - **b.** Grades 6-8 must be offered ¾ cup red/orange vegetables per week but were only offered 3/8 cup for the week.
  - **c.** Grade 9 must be offered 1 ¼ cup red/orange vegetables per week but were only offered 3/8 cup for the week.
