 Upon review of the district's eligibility documentation, the following was noted: Of the 232 eligibility source documents reviewed, there were thirteen (13) errors noted. Two (2) applications were missing mandatory information including household members and/or income information. One (1) application was determined as reduced but was coded as free. Five (5) applications were found to be processed as denied but coded as free. Five (5) applications were processed and denied but coded as reduced. Upon further review of eligibility documentation and meal count consolidation, it was found that for the month of August 2022, the School Food Authority (SFA) claimed all students, regardless of meal status, at the free rate. Upon interview with CND, it was determined that insufficient records were maintained to document verification for the 2022-2023 school year. Documentation including applications selected for verification, proof of household income, Verification Trackers, Verification Narrative, required letters, and any other communication with households was unavailable upon request.

- 1. Upon review of breakfast and lunch production records for the week of October 17-21, 2022, at Arkansas Arts Highschool, the following was noted:
 - Accurate documentation was not maintained. At lunch, there was no clear indication of number of portions served. For both breakfast and lunch, if substitutions to menus items listed on production records were made, crediting was not updated.
 - On October 21, 2022, only a ½ cup of fruit was offered at lunch.

- 1. At the time of the review, it was found that several non-domestic food items did not have a signed Buy American Justification form.
- 2. During the review it was found that the school SFA was not receiving or reviewing Food Service Management Company's (FSMC) menu selections two (2) weeks prior to service as outlined in the FSMC contract on page twenty-one (21).
- 3. The SFA was selling low calorie, no calorie flavored, and caffeinated beverages in addition to 7th and 8th graders.
