Upon review of the 2022-2023 verification, several issues were identified: It was found that the district pulled the incorrect number of applications for verification. The District preformed standard sampling and eight (8) applications should have been selected, however, nine (9) applications were selected Per 7 CFR 245.6a(5), SFAs must pull three (3) percent of all applications approved by the local educational agency for the school year, as of October 1 of the school year, selected from error prone applications. It was found that households who were selected for verification were notified of selection over the phone. 7 CFR 245.6a(f) households selected for verification must be notified in writing that their applications were selected for verification. Nine (9) applications pulled for verification none were confirmed by the confirming official. Per 7 CFR 245 6a(e)(I)(i), prior to conducting any other verification activity, an individual, other than the individual who made the initial eligibility determination, shall review for accuracy each approved application selected for verification to ensure the initial determination was correct. Two (2) of the households submitted verification documentation that listed net income instead of gross income. Per federal regulation 7 CFR 245.6a(a)(7)(i) and 7 CFR 245.6a(a)(7)(ii), the only acceptable documents for verification are wage stubs, award letters, letters from employers, and/or collateral contact. Four (4) households submitted verification documentation that were missing income data. These errors included only submitting documentation to support one adult's income when two adults were listed as receiving income on the application. Per 7 CFR 245.6a(5)(i), verification documentation must include the income received by each member identified by the household member who received the income or an indication which household members had no income; and the source of the income.
