This resulted in an overclaim of \$9. The Arkansas Department of Education, Child Nutrition Unit (ADE, CNU) may disregard an overclaim if the overclaim does not exceed \$600 per program. The disregard may be made once per Federal fiscal year for any review or activity. This overclaim is disregarded. 2. A review of the 2021-2022 verification indicated that two (2) of the seventeen (17) households reviewed submitted income documentation from the previous year. In accordance with 7 CFR 245.6a(f)(2) the documentation must indicate the source, amount and frequency of all income and can be for any point in time between the month prior to application for school meal benefits and the time the household is requested to provide income documentation. 3. The districts meal charge policy states that students may be denied a meal due to excessive charges. In accordance with The Hunger-Free Student's Bill of Rights Act 428 of 2019 requires schools to provide a student requesting a meal or snack one that is no different from those served to their peers.
