## Findings:

- 1) Upon review of the ninety-one (91) source documents, one (1) application was denied incorrectly based on income. The household should have been reduced. In accordance with 7 CFR 245.6(c)(4) When a household submits an application containing complete documentation and the household's total current income is at or below the eligibility limits specified in the Income Eligibility Guidelines the children in that household must be approved for free or reduced price benefits, as applicable.
- 2) Upon review of verification documentation for the 2021-2022 school year the following was discovered:
  - Verification letters that were sent to households had the incorrect nondiscrimination statement. Per FNS 113-1 IX A(3), all information materials and sources, including Web sites, used by FNS, State agencies, local agencies, or other subrecipients to inform the public about FNS programs must contain a nondiscrimination statement.
  - One household did not provide income documentation for each income source listed on the household application. In accordance with 7 CFR 245.6a(f)(4) households refusing to cooperate with efforts to verify, eligibility for free or reduced price benefits shall be terminated.
- 3)Upon review of daily records for January 2022 it was discovered that the high school meal counts for breakfast and lunch were not consolidated for the claim for reimbursement. In addition, daily rosters for lunch at the elementary school was inaccurately counted. This resulted in an underclaim of \$3,354.00 at breakfast and

\$12,494.40 at lunch. In accordance with 7 CFR 220.14 and 7 CFR § 210.8 (b) (4), state agencies must take corrective action in response to any claim for reimbursement filed in error.

4) Upon review of meal counting and claiming procedures, it was discovered that the district was taking lunch counts in the classroom prior to the lunch service. In accordance with 7 CFR 210.7(c)(1)(iii) the Claim for Reimbursement accurately reflects the number of lunches, taken daily at the point of service, which correctly identify the number of free, reduced price and paid lunches served to eligible children.

- 1) Upon review of production records and supporting documentation for the week of December 3-7, 2021, the following was discovered:
  - On one (1) of the five (5) days only ½ cup fruit was offered to students at breakfast. In accordance with 7 CFR 220.8(c) grades K-8 must be offered 1 cup of fruit at breakfast.
  - Over the week of review 55.5% of the total fruit offered was from juice. In accordance with 7 CFR 220.8(c)(b) No more than half of the fruit or vegetable offerings may be in the form of juice.
