Findings: Upon review of product information and grain crediting documentation, it was discovered that (2) non-whole grain rich products were being credited as whole grain rich (WGR). The biscuit served at breakfast on December 10, 2021, and the French toast sticks served at lunch on December 7, 2021, did not meet the WGR criteria. Serving non-whole grain rich products during meal service without offering any other whole grain rich items to students, does not meet meal pattern requirements for the age groups of 6-8 and 9-12. 7 CFR 210.10(c) and 7CFR 220.8(1)(c). Grains crediting to meet meal pattern requirements must be made with at least 50% whole grains per item.

Findings:

The School Food Authority (SFA) did not have documentation of School Breakfast Program (SBP) Outreach or Summer Feeding Outreach. According to 7 CFR 210.12(d)(1) and 7 CFR 210.12(d)(2), to the maximum extent practicable, SFAs must inform families about the availability of breakfasts for students and must be distributed prior to the beginning of the school year and are encouraged to send reminders regarding the availability of the School Breakfast Program. SFAs also must cooperate with Summer Food Service Program sponsors to distribute materials to inform families of the availability and location of free Summer Food Service Program meals for students when school is not in session.
