Out of 227 eligibility documents reviewed, one application was approved without including two sources of household income. The error resulted in the eligibility statuses of four students changing from free to reduced-price meals. 2) The SFA did not use the sample size option designated by the state agency. The SFA chose the Alternate I sampling method, but the SFA should have used the Standard 3% error-prone method. 3) One application out of the four verified resulted in a decrease in benefits for one student. The household was not given 10 calendar days prior to the status changing from free to reduced-price meals. **Meal Patterns and Nutritional Quality** YES NO Technical Assistance Corrective Action Meal Components and Quantities \checkmark Offer versus Serve Dietary Specifications and Nutrient Analysis П П Findings: 1) For the week of menu review, the 7-12 breakfast menu did not meet the minimum daily and weekly requirements for grain. 2) For the week of menu review, the 7-8 lunch menu did not meet the minimum daily requirements for vegetables. 3) For the week of menu review, the 9-12 lunch menu did not meet the minimum daily and weekly requirements for vegetables. 4) For the week of menu review, the 7-8 and 9-12 lunch menus did not meet the minimum weekly requirement for the red/orange vegetable subgroup. Red/orange vegetables were offered, but not in large enough quantities to meet the weekly requirement. C.
