**IN RE THE MATTER OF
AMBER KIDWELL
AUGUST 12, 2021**

**LICENSURE ACTION

At its regular meeting on August 12, 2021, the Arkansas State Board of Education (“Board”) considered the matter of Amber Kidwell (“Educator Kidwell”) concerning a true report on the Child Maltreatment Central Registry. Based upon the evidence presented, in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act, Ark. Code Ann. § 25-15-101 et seq., the Board hereby states as follows:

I. Findings of Fact:

- a. The Division received information that Amber Kidwell (“Educator Kidwell”) has a true report on the Child Maltreatment Central Registry which is disqualifying for a teacher licensed under Ark. Code Ann. § 6-17-410(c).
- b. Educator Kidwell was notified of the revocation, and had thirty (30) days to request a waiver hearing on the revocation of her license.
- c. Educator Kidwell requested a hearing.
- d. The Board considered:
 - i. The educator’s age at the time of the offense;
 - ii. The circumstances surrounding the offense;
 - iii. The length of time since the offense;
 - iv. The educator’s subsequent work history;
 - v. The educator’s employment and character references; and
 - vi. Other evidence demonstrating that the applicant does not pose a threat to the health or safety of school children or school personnel.
- e. A motion was made and seconded to grant a waiver of the Child Maltreatment Central Registry for Educator Kidwell. The motion carried.

II. Conclusions of Law

- a. The State Board of Education may consider the enumerated offenses as a disqualification for licensing including a true finding and placement on the Child Maltreatment Central Registry. See Ark. Code Ann. §§ 6-17-410(c), 6-17-410(d) (A)(5) and 6-17-411. This includes offenses which have been expunged, sealed, and pardoned by the governor.
- b. Upon consideration of the evidence presented at the meeting and pursuant to Ark. Code Ann. §§ 6-11-105, 6-17-410 and 25-15-201 et seq., Educator Kidwell is granted a licensure waiver and thus, is eligible for employment in an educational setting.
