## THE ARKANSAS STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION

IN RE THE MATTER OF DENNIS JOHNSON MARCH 9, 2023 LICENSURE ACTION CASE NO.: LA-23-002

At its regular meeting on March 9, 2023, the Arkansas State Board of Education ("Board") considered the matter of Dennis Johnson ("Educator Johnson") concerning a true report on the Child Maltreatment Central Registry. Based upon the evidence presented, in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act, Ark. Code Ann. § 25-15-101 et seq., the Board hereby states as follows:

## I. Findings of Fact:

- a. The Division received information that Dennis Johnson ("Educator Johnson") has a true report on the Child Maltreatment Central Registry which is disqualifying for a teacher licensed under Ark. Code Ann. § 6-17-410(c).
- b. Educator Johnson was notified of the true report and had thirty (30) days to request a waiver hearing with the State Board of Education.
- c. Educator Johnson requested a hearing.
- d. The Board considered:
  - i. The educator's age at the time of the offense;
  - ii. The circumstances surrounding the offense;
  - iii. The length of time since the offense;
  - iv. The educator's subsequent work history;
  - v. The educator's employment and character references; and
  - vi. Other evidence demonstrating that the applicant does not pose a threat to the health or safety of school children or school personnel.
- e. At the State Board meeting, following the educator's waiver of a hearing a motion was made and seconded to grant a waiver of the disqualifying true report. The motion carried.

## II. Conclusions of Law

- a. The State Board of Education may consider the enumerated offenses as a disqualification for licensing including a true finding and placement on the Child Maltreatment Central Registry. See Ark. Code Ann. §§ 6-17-410(c), 6-17-410(d) (A)(5) and 6-17-411. This includes offenses which have been expunged, sealed, and pardoned by the governor.
- b. Upon consideration of the evidence presented at the meeting and pursuant to Ark. Code Ann.
  §§ 6-11-105, 6-17-410 and 25-15-201 et seq., Educator Johnson is granted a licensure waiver and thus, is eligible for employment in an educational setting.
