Findings:

- 1. Upon review of school policies, it was discovered that the district does have a meal modifications policy however this policy is not being communicated to households. In accordance with 7 CFR 15b.7(a) SFAs must notify families of the process for requesting meal modifications.
- 2. Upon review of wellness documentation, the following was discovered:
 - a. The district's wellness policy has not been made available to the public. In accordance with 7 CFR 210.31(d) SFAs must inform the public about the content and implementation of the local school wellness policy and make the policy and any updates to the policy available to the public on an annual basis.
 - b. The triennial assessment has not been completed. In accordance with 7 CFR 210.31(e)(2) At least once every three years, assess schools' compliance with the local school wellness policy, and make assessment results available to the public. The assessment must measure the implementation of the local school wellness policy, and include:
 - i. The extent to which schools under the jurisdiction of the local educational agency are in compliance with the local school wellness policy;
 - ii. The extent to which the local educational agency's local school wellness policy compares to model local school wellness policies; and
 - **iii.** A description of the progress made in attaining the goals of the local school wellness policy.
- 3. Upon review of the dry food storage area the following was discovered:
 - a. Several products were found without a date. Foods must be labeled and dated in storage to ensure adherence to food safety standards in Arkansas Department if Health Food Code 3-501.16.
 - b. Several expired items were discovered. To ensure the health and safety of consumers, foods that have spoiled or passed the manufacturer's recommended expiration date must be discarded.
