The grade 9-12 lunch meal pattern minimum requirement is 1 cup vegetable per day 7 CFR 210.10(c). On December 7, 9 and 10, 3/4 cup of vegetable was offered. The Meal Certification Worksheets also revealed that the weekly minimum requirement for the red/orange vegetable subgroup was not met. The grade 9-12 lunch meal pattern minimum requirement for the red/ orange subgroup is 1 1/4 cup per week, 7 CFR 210.10(c). For the week of December 6th, a total of 1 cup was offered. Upon completion of the USDA Meal Certification Worksheets for the week of December 6-10, 2021, the total amount of whole grains served did not meet the minimum whole grain requirement. 7 CFR 210.10(c)(2)(iv). All grains must be made with enriched and whole grain meal or flour, in accordance with the most recent grains Food and Nutrition Service guidance. Whole grain-rich products must contain at least 51 percent whole grains and the remaining grains in the product must be enriched. For the week of December 6th, 65.3% of grains were whole grain rich. Meals served three (3) of the five (5) days did not serve the adequate amount of whole grain. On December 7th, 2.25oz of grains were served, only 1oz was whole grain. On December 8th, 2oz grains were served, only 1oz was whole grain. On December 9th, 2oz of grain was served, none of the grains were whole grain rich. C.
