Six (6) applications selected for verification were changed to paid due to the household's failure to respond to verification. These students were stopped by the food service management company (FSMC) director was able to direct students back to the point of sale

to complete the reimbursable meal. Upon speaking with the kitchen lead she stated that she knew students had to have three items but didn't know one item had to be a  $\frac{1}{2}$  cup of

fruit.

Findings:  1) Upon review of a la carte items sold to students it was discovered that the Smartpop white cheddar popcorn did not meet smart snack requirements. In accordance with 7 CFR 210.11(b)(3) all foods sold at school during the school day are required to meet nutrition standards.  2) Upon review of the dry storage, cooler and freezer several products were found without a date. Foods must be labeled and dated in storage (dry storage, coolers, and freezers) to ensure adherence to food safety standards in Arkansas Department of Health Food Code 3-501.16. When received, all foods should be dated to ensure proper use and safety of food supply (FIFO -first in-first out inventory procedures).  3) Upon review of the wellness documentation the following was discovered:  • The most recent triennial assessment was completed in 2018-2019 school year. In accordance with 7 CFR 210.31(e)(2) At least once every three years, assess schools' compliance with the local school wellness policy, and make assessment results available to the public.  • The wellness committee only held three meetings in the 2021-2022 school year. Documentation including agendas and meeting minutes did not contain information related to menu feedback from the wellness committee. In accordance with AR Code § 6-20-709 each school district shall provide to the school district's school nutrition and physical activity advisory committee: information on the requirements and standards of the program; and menus for the program and other food sold in the school cafeteria on a quarterly basis.
