PLSB CASE NO. 23-082

FINDINGS OF FACT, CONCLUSIONS OF LAW, AND ORDER

At its regular meeting on July 13, 2023, the Arkansas State Board of Education ("Board") accepted the recommendation of the Professional Licensure Standards Board Ethics

Subcommittee ("Ethics Subcommittee") for disciplinary action against the teaching license of Brittney Lee Harrod ("Educator Harrod"). Based upon Educator Harrod's failure to respond to the Ethics Subcommittee's recommendation and the evidence presented, in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act, Ark. Code Ann. 25-15-101 et seq., the Board hereby states as follows:

I. Findings of Fact

- a. The Arkansas Department of Education issued Educator Harrod a standard teaching license on December 14, 2020, valid until December 31, 2024.
- b. The Ethics Subcommittee received an allegation that Educator Harrod violated the Arkansas Department of Education Rules Governing the Code of Ethics for Arkansas Educators promulgated pursuant to Ark. Code Ann. § § 6-17-422 and 6-17-428.
- c. On February 3, 2023, the Ethics Subcommittee authorized an investigation into allegations that Educator Harrod violated Standard 1: an educator maintains a professional relationship with each student, both in and outside the classroom; Standard 2: an educator maintains competence regarding his or her professional

- practice, inclusive of professional and ethical behavior, skills, knowledge, dispositions, and responsibilities relating to his or her organizational position.
- d. Educator Harrod was notified on February 3, 2023, of the Ethics Subcommittee's authorization to investigate this allegation.
- e. After considering the investigator's report and evidence on June 2, 2023, the Ethics Subcommittee unanimously found that a preponderance of evidence existed to substantiate violation of Standards 1 and 2 in that Educator Harrod:
 - Inappropriate communication with a student(s).
 - Physical and/or sexual contact with a student(s).
 - Inappropriate relationship with a student(s).
 - Exhibited inappropriate disposition inclusive of professional and ethical behavior.
 - Violated district, state or federal policies or law.
- f. The Ethics Subcommittee recommended that the State Board take the following actions:
 - 1. Permanent revocation of license.
 - 2. Assess a \$500 fine (due within 90 days of the State Board Order);
- g. On June 5, 2023, Educator Harrod's attorney, was notified of the Ethics

 Subcommittee's initial determination and recommendation by secure server. Educator

 Harrod failed to respond to the Ethics Subcommittee's recommendation thereby

 waiving her right to any further notice, hearing, or any other rights she may have

 under the Administrative Procedure Act, including those rights set forth in Ark. Code

 Ann. §§ 25-15-211 and 25-15-212.
- h. At today's meeting, the Ethics Subcommittee's recommendation and supporting documentation were presented to the Board as part of its consent agenda.

II. Conclusions of Law

of the Code of Ethics.

a. Upon consideration of the evidence presented at the meeting, Ark. Code Ann. §§ 6-11-105, 6-17-401, 6-17-422, 6-17-428 and 25-15-201 et seq., and the Arkansas Department of Education Rules Governing the Code of Ethics for Arkansas Educators, the Board adopts the Ethics Subcommittee's recommendations, and enacts the sanctions accordingly. The Board admonishes Educator Harrod for her violation

b. This order shall remain permanently in Educator Harrod's professional licensure file and the confidential files of the Professional Licensure Standards Board.
