FINDINGS OF FACT, CONCLUSIONS OF LAW, AND ORDER

At its regular meeting on July 11, 2024, the Arkansas State Board of Education (“Board”) accepted the recommendation of the Professional Licensure Standards Board Ethics Subcommittee (“Ethics Subcommittee”) for disciplinary action against the teaching license of Joseph Stephen Drye (“Educator Drye”). Based upon Educator Drye’s acceptance of the Ethics Subcommittee’s recommendation and the evidence presented, in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act, Ark. Code Ann. 25-15-101 et seq., the Board hereby states as follows:

1) Findings of Fact

- a) The Arkansas Department of Education issued Educator Drye a standard five-year teaching license on January 1, 2024, valid until December 31, 2028.
- b) The Ethics Subcommittee received an allegation that Educator Drye violated the Arkansas Department of Education Rules Governing the Code of Ethics for Arkansas Educators promulgated pursuant to Ark. Code Ann. § § 6-17-422 and 6-17-428.
- c) On February 2, 2024, the Ethics Subcommittee authorized an investigation into allegations that Educator Drye violated *Standard 1: an educator maintains a professional relationship with each student, both in and outside the classroom;* *Standard 2: an educator maintains competence regarding his or her professional practice, inclusive of professional and ethical behavior, skills, knowledge,*

dispositions, and responsibilities relating to his or her organizational position; and Standard 4: an educator entrusted with public funds and property, including school sponsored activity funds, honors that trust with honest, responsible stewardship.

- d) Educator Drye was notified on February 6, 2024, of the Ethics Subcommittee's authorization to investigate this allegation.
- e) After considering the investigator's report and evidence on June 7, 2024, the Ethics Subcommittee unanimously found that a preponderance of evidence existed to substantiate violation of Standards 1, 2 and 4 in that Educator Drye:
- Inappropriate interactions with student(s).
 - Exhibited inappropriate disposition inclusive of professional and ethical behavior.
 - Violated district, state or federal policies or law.
 - Misuse of school property.
- f) The Ethics Subcommittee recommended that the State Board take the following actions:
- (1) Probation of License for 2 years;
 - (2) Assess a \$250.00 fine (due within 90 days of the State Board Order);
 - (3) Require Educator to complete the following coursework/readings:
 - (a) Code of Ethics Training Provided by the PLSB (1.5 Hours)
 - (b) Title: The 85% Solution: How Personal Accountability Guarantees Success -- No Nonsense, No Excuses (256p) Author: Linda Galindo ISBN 10: ISBN 13: 9780470500163
 - (c) Title: The Power Paradox: How We Gain and Lose Influence (208p) Author: Dacher Keltner ISBN 10: 0143110292 ISBN 13: 978-0143110293
 - (d) Title: You've Gotta Connect: Building Relationships that Lead to Engaged Students, Productive Classrooms, and Higher Achievement (280 Pages)

- (4) Educator to provide written reflection on each training/book regarding how the educator will improve his professional practices in the future. Due to the PLSB for approval within 90 days of the State Board Order;
 - (5) Quarterly reports from the educator's supervisor regarding the educator's progress on professional practices have improved; and
 - (6) Require Educator to pay all associated costs.
- g) On June 7, 2024, Educator Drye, was notified of the Ethics Subcommittee's initial determination and recommendation by secure email. Educator Drye accepted the Ethics Subcommittee's recommendation thereby waiving his right to any further notice, hearing, or any other rights he may have under the Administrative Procedure Act, including those rights set forth in Ark. Code Ann. §§ 25-15-211 and 25-15-212.
- h) At today's meeting, the Ethics Subcommittee's recommendation and supporting documentation were presented to the Board as part of its consent agenda.

2) Conclusions of Law

- a) Upon consideration of the evidence presented at the meeting, Ark. Code Ann. §§ 6-11-105, 6-17-401, 6-17-422, 6-17-428 and 25-15-201 et seq., and the Arkansas Department of Education Rules Governing the Code of Ethics for Arkansas Educators, the Board adopts the Ethics Subcommittee's recommendations, and enacts the sanctions accordingly. The Board admonishes Educator Joseph Drye for his violation of the Code of Ethics.
- b) Educator Drye is cautioned that his non-payment of the assessed fine of \$250.00 may result in the suspension of his license until the fine is paid in full.

- c) Educator Drye is cautioned that further violations of the Code of Ethics or failure to pay the fine within ninety (90) days from the date of this order may result in more severe discipline including permanent revocation of his license.
- d) This order shall remain permanently in Educator Drye's professional licensure file and the confidential files of the Professional Licensure Standards Board.
