 Of the 380 student eligibility source documents reviewed, it was discovered that there were eleven (11) students coded or determined incorrectly in eSchool and the point of sale (POS) system. According to 7 CFR 210.7(c)(l)(i), SFA must correctly approve each child's eligibility for free and reduced meals. One (1) student was given a reduced status when they should have been free. Two (2) students were given a reduced status when they should have been paid. Five (5) students were given a free status when they should have been paid. Five (5) students were given a free status when they should have been reduced. One (1) of those was correctly determined reduced but was coded free. A review of the 2022-23 verification documentation indicated that three (4) of the six (9) households selected submitted unacceptable (including 2021 tax form and screenshots of direct deposit) or incomplete income documentation. In accordance with 7 CFR 245.6a(f)(2), the documentation must indicate the source, amount, frequency, date, name of recipient, and be reflective of current gross income from any point between the month prior to the free and reduced meal application turned in and the time the household is request to provide the income documentation. According to 7 CFR 245.6a(a)(7)(ii), if the household does not submit documentation for all incomes listed on the original application or via a collateral contact, the eligibility must be terminated.

- On one (1) of the five (5) days, only 0.75-ounce equivalent of grain was served. According to 7 CFR 210.10(c), the daily requirement for grains is one (1) ounce equivalent for grades K-8.
