3) For the week of menu review, the K-4 lunch menu did not meet the minimum weekly requirement for the red/orange vegetable subgroup.				
4) For the week of menu review, the K-4 lunch menu did not meet the minimum weekly requirement for the beans/legumes vegetable subgroup.				
5) For the week of menu review, the 8 and 9 lunch menus did not meet the minimum daily and weekly requirements for grain.

Findings:

- 1) The SFA sells items that do not meet the Smart Snacks nutrition standards for beverages. The 16 oz. Body Armor exceeds the allowable volume limits in Arkansas state statute. The beverage selection in the vending machine outside of the Russellville Junior High cafeteria is not comprised of 50% fruit juice, low fat/no fat milk and unflavored, unsweetened water.
- 2) The SFA does not maintain a medical statement on file for students in need of dietary accommodation related to food or beverage items.
