A review of the 2022-23 verification documentation indicated that three (3) of the six (6) households selected submitted unacceptable (including 2021 tax form and screenshots of direct deposit) or incomplete income documentation. In accordance with 7 CFR 245.6a(f)(2), the documentation must indicate the source, amount, frequency, date, name of recipient, and be reflective of current gross income from any point between the month prior to the free and reduced meal application turned in and the time the household is request to provide the income documentation. According to 7 CFR 245.6a(a)(7)(ii), if the household does not submit documentation for all incomes listed on the original application or via a collateral contact, the eligibility must be terminated. Technical assistance was provided to the child nutrition secretary about what is acceptable income documentation as well as the USDA Eligibility Guidance Manual and verification PowerPoint. 2. Of the 280 student eligibility source documents reviewed, there were seven (7) students that were coded incorrectly in eSchool and the point of sale (POS) system. Three (3) of these students were coded as directly certified (DC), yet they were not found on the DC lists for this school year, therefore these students should have been coded as paid. Tw (2) of these students were given a free status based on a migrant status yet they were not found on a migrant list and there was no documentation of a meal application provided, therefore these students should have been coded as paid.

Two (2) of these students were given a free status, yet there was no source documentation

provided, therefore these students should have been coded as paid.
