Tips from the Arkansas Attorney General's Office

- Talk to children about sexual victimization and online dangers.
- Keep passwords, pictures, and personal information to themselves.
- Never arrange a face-to-face meeting with someone they first met online.
- Do not respond to messages that are inappropriate or uncomfortable.
- Never assume that what is told online is the truth.
- Encourage children to tell an adult if they ever encounter a problem online.
