Arkansas students are already making history as national leaders in coding and computer science. Now, they get to make history again.

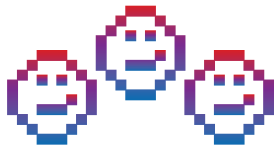

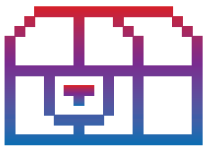

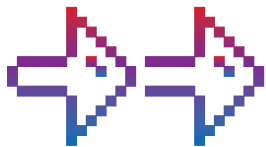
FAST FACTS
